Please describe how you will manage the following situations:

Situation one:

During a Town Hall Meeting (a meeting where all the students attend and have the opportunity to present their complaints and concerns to the administration) one student stands up and complains about the Campus Policy of “No guests are allowed to sleep on campus”. His girlfriend is coming to visit and he wants to her to have the ability to spend the night with him. He becomes agitated and frustrated about this issue. How would you handle the situation?

Situation two:

While sleeping on campus one night you are awake at 3.00 am by students complaining about the loud noises coming from across the hall. Once you have identify which room the noise come from, you knock on the door and upon opening the door, you realize a couple of students have been drinking. There are open containers of alcohol in plain view. Drinking in the dorm is strictly prohibited and the students are aware of this policy. When you tell them to be quiet, one of the students becomes confrontational and tells you that there is no class the next day and he shouldn't have to be quiet. You repeat the policy to him when he screams loudly in your face to go to hell. How do you respond and what do you do next?

Situation three:

One student approaches you while doing a campus stroll and tells you she wants to go home. She said she cannot eat the food in the cafeteria, she does not get along together well with her loud roommate and she does not like the courses she is taking. She misses her family and friends and she feels uncomfortable in a country where she does not speak the language. What would your response to her be?

Situation four:

You have been put in charge of a project focusing on the creating a new student activity. During the course of the project you become aware that your supervisor is unable to provide you with the help you need. Your colleagues all appear busy with their different projects and duties. How do you respond to the situation?
