Session Offerings

Session I:

May 19th—29th (arrive on May 18th) Topics in Accounting: Business Fraud Risks Paul Mason, University of Kansas (3 credits)

This course explores various academic approaches to fraud, including factors learned from other disciplines such as sociology and psychology. Some of the topics covered include: skimming transactions, identity fraud, computer schemes, money laundering, bribery and kickbacks, and corporate espionage. (Prerequisite: At least one introductory accounting course)

Session II:

June 2nd—11th (arrive on June 1st)
Topics in Management Sciences: Lean Six Sigma
Pat Hammett, University of Michigan (3 credits)

This course incorporates the most widely-used concepts and tools from both Lean and Six Sigma and shows their applications within the DMAIC problem solving approach. We will examine the application of DMAIC toward quick win problem solving situations aimed at eliminating waste and consider more comprehensive DMAIC applications where new data must be collected and analyzed to identify the best improvement plan. Key lessons are reinforced through exercises, case studies, and in-class simulations.

Optional: Complete additional project/training after program dates to receive Green Belt Certification (additional fee of approximately \$500).

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- Completion of an undergraduate degree
- 2.5 GPA or higher depending on home university requirements
- Must be approved by home university to study abroad
- · Valid passport or ability to obtain one
- Ability to obtain an Italian visa (non-US citizens) No Italian language requirement

Cost for one session: \$3,000 Cost for both sessions: \$6.000
